The Warehouse Precinct Revitalisation Plan was the DCC's response to the request from a group of property owners in 2010 to try to save the impressive heritage buildings in the area.

The Warehouse Precinct Revitalisation Plan was a collaborative effort, aiming to bring together a range of heritage, transport, amenity and planning interventions to change the fortunes of the area. The plan was premised on close interaction between the public and private spheres and a willingness to experiment with an incentives and "red-carpet" based approach.

Launched at a time when there was a great deal of pressure on council budgets, the funds available for investing in the plan were limited, meaning physical interventions had to be targeted and deliver





clear, tangible benefits. Physical interventions were focused around improved access to the area and expanding opportunities for increased business, creative and residential activity.

Join this tour to learn about the broader revitalisation efforts in the area and the way that targeted transport initiatives were linked to a holistic plan to bring an important quarter of the city back to life.

You'll see and hear about what has worked, what hasn't and how the lessons learnt in this area are being rolled out to other parts of Dunedin. You will see how even limited transport interventions can deliver significant benefits when targeted wisely.
